Additional Activity: Team Chant

In the island of Bali, Indonesia, one of the countries students can visit by watching the [Mission Briefing Video: How RUTF is made](#), there is a chant that is known as the Kecak. Incorporating Balinese dance and music, this chant is known as the Monkey Chant, and has been part of the Balinese culture for many decades.

Based on an ancient Sanskrit story where an army of monkeys rescue a princess named Sita, the Monkey Chant has now become one of Bali's iconic cultural dances that attracts eyes from around the world. [Watch a modern version of Kecak](#) or see how [students in San Diego](#) reenact the chant.

As a UNICEF Kid Power team, you are also part of a global effort to end malnutrition around the world. To celebrate this journey, create a team chant, dance or a mix of both!
